### **MOREHOUSE PUBLISHING:**

**Episcopal Children's Curriculum** uses biblical storytelling, the study of church traditions and participation in worship to teach Christian faith and what it means to live out the covenant made in Holy Baptism. The curriculum extends over nine years for children from ages 3 to 11. Lessons are organized around the seasons of the Church year and draw from The Bible, The Book of Common Prayer, the hymnal, church liturgy and tradition. ECC lesson plans include tips for adapting sessions to small and large class sizes and offer a variety of fun activities that help children grasp important concepts.

**Episcopal Curriculum for Youth**, for young people 12 to 18 years, can be used in Sunday School or for youth group meetings, retreats, lock-ins, camps, conferences, or almost anywhere that you come together. ECY is divided into units for Younger Youth (Middle School and Junior High) and Older Youth (Senior High). People directly engaged in youth work and young people themselves helped write the curriculum through The Center for the Ministry of Teaching at Virginia Theological Seminary.

**Living the Good News** offers lectionary-based curriculum that follows the Revised Common Lectionary, a three-year cycle of Sunday scripture readings covering most of the New Testament and much of the Old Testament. The curriculum is packaged for children in preschool all the way through high school and for adults as well. Each age level has separate materials for three seasons with a leader's guide and participant worksheets. Episcopal, Catholic, and Lutheran versions are available.

**My Episcopal Faith** is a series of seven (K-6) booklets which introduce children to the history, beliefs, structure and lore of the Episcopal Church. Leader's Guide provides lessons that are easy to prepare and teach. Student booklets for class or home use are a great resource of prayers, information and family activities. My Episcopal Faith can be used with Share the Joy or as a standalone program for up to 6 weeks.

**Share the Joy** is a Sunday school curriculum for grades K-6 that teaches the foundations of faith based on the Word of God. The program is organized into self-contained thematic sessions and follows the seasons of the church year. The materials include a teacher's guide and student pack with weekly lesson booklets to cover the entire year.

#### **The Journey to Adulthood (Rite-13, J2A, YAC)**

A complete youth ministry program of spiritual formation for 11-18 year olds. It uses Bible study, prayer, rites of passage, outreach ministries and both serious and playful activities to underscore its core messages:

1) Manhood and womanhood are gifts from God. 2) Adulthood must be earned.

#### **Wizards and Wonders: A Hero's Journey With Harry Potter**

Based on the Harry Potter books, this 5 session intergenerational program can be used as vacation Bible school, summer Sunday school, or as a unit in a regular Sunday school. Through drama, crafts and games, participants connect the hero's story to Bible stories. In an engaging set of experiences, mirroring some of Harry's, you will explore issues of identity, alliances, team work, spiritual gifts, life's direction, temptations, moral choices, courage and faith. Play Quidditch with fervor, receive owl mail, and face "your deepest fears and greatest temptations and discover that even these can be overcome by faith, friendship, and the gifts of God which you will be led to discover in your own heart." (Molly, adult participant)

#### **Come and Worship**

This Children's Chapel resource, developed by Holy Trinity Parish in Clemson, SC and previously distributed by them, provides a creative children's liturgy for each of the three years (A, B, C). It is an age appropriate worship option for younger children, especially in a congregation where Sunday School is at an hour separate from worship.

The readings have been re-written and in some cases replaced so they appeal to younger children. Children begin in the sanctuary and those who choose to do so leave to hear the lessons, join in a simplified Psalm, participate in an interactive homily, the prayers and music. They return to their parents at the time of the peace

**The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** is an approach to the religious formation of children. It is rooted in the Bible, the liturgy of the church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. Children gather in an "atrium," a room prepared for them, which contains simple yet beautiful materials that they use.

You may be wondering how these materials help the religious life of children? If an adult hears a beautiful passage from the Bible, the adult might take a Bible, find the passage, and read it slowly again and again. He or she may think deeply about the words and perhaps speak to God in a thankful or hopeful prayer. But a little child, too young to read, needs another way. In an atrium the child can ponder a biblical passage or a prayer from the liturgy by taking the material for that text and working with it - placing wood figures of sheep in a sheepfold of the Good Shepherd, setting sculpted apostles around a Last Supper table, or preparing a small altar with the furnishings used for the Eucharist. Older children who do read often copy parables from the Bible, lay in order written prayers from the rite of baptism, or label a long time line showing the history of the kingdom of God.

The goal of Godly Play™ is to teach children the art of using religious language - parable, sacred story, silence, and liturgical action - to help them become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence in their lives.

Godly Play™ was developed and classroom tested for more than twenty years by Episcopal priest, author, and teacher Jerome Berryman. The Godly Play™ method is currently being used in churches of many denominations throughout the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, and Canada.
